With flexibility being the hottest topic in today's library, everything is expected to be movable and reconfigurable. Including the shelving itself.

When your shelving can move it allows you to open up an area to accommodate a large group our create a smaller area for story time or other functions. You can move a section of shelving to your entrance to highlight a particular collection or new books; the possibilities are endless.



Your concern may be two fold, maybe you do not like the look of wheels or maybe you do not want the public moving the shelving around. The solution is invisible (concealed) wheels; only you and your staff know they are there and that the shelving can roll.

The shelving shown here is equipped with a standard caster. Clearly anyone would be able to tell that row of shelving is mobile. They also provide more of an industrial look.









Where as the shelving shown on this page has MJ's concealed caster. The library staff knows the shelving can roll but patrons do not. This type of caster offers a much cleaner aesthetic.
